Eagle Press: Primary Classes

How is it already December!?
In Kindergarten, we are ready for some holiday themed activities to wrap up the month. We will have a Holidays Around the World all Day Rotation to celebrate and learn about different holidays celebrated in Israel, Germany, Italy, Puerto Rico, and France. In each classroom we will create a craft and even enjoy some snacks. In order for us to complete these fun activities, we will be asking for parent donations of supplies. Keep an eye on your email or let us know if you can bring something in. We appreciate it!

We are spending two weeks talking about all things Gingerbread. We will read a variety of Gingerbread stories: Gingerbread Man, Gingerbread Girl, Gingerbread Baby and some other fun stories. After reading, we will retell the story, identify story elements, and write about the stories.

In Math, we are starting our unit on Addition. You will hear students talking about the plus sign and equal sign. We will incorporate some fun activities to teach these skills to match our holiday themes. Thank you for all of your support – we could not do any of this without the help and support of our amazing Kindergarten Parents!

Happy December, First Grade Families!
We hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving with your family and friends. We know the holiday excitement is starting to build so please maintain normal routines as much as possible in the weeks leading up to winter break. Children need predictability and consistency as we will continue to work hard in December.

In Reading, we will be diving deeper into explaining what it means to wait, be patient, and be kind. Please discuss what it means to be patient with your child. Please continue to reinforce quarter 1 and quarter 2 sight words and continue practicing writing complete sentences for phonics.

In math, we will be continuing to practice addition and subtraction within 20 to finish out this calendar year! In science, we will discuss the sky and things we see in the sky. We will continue to discuss economics in Social Studies. As you are making your December plans, please keep in mind that December 18th, 19th, and 20th are Early Release days with a 1:00 P.M. dismissal. Please have an enjoyable, restful holiday break and Happy New Year and as always, we thank you for your support!

The students enjoyed the in-school presentation by Sawgrass, a Native American who shared the lifestyle of his people long ago and compared it with our current day lifestyle. Ask them to share some of the things they learned.

In math, we have been reviewing double digit addition and subtraction within 100. In 2nd grade the children are expected to use strategies including expanded form, partial sums, base ten blocks, compensation to show their work. Knowing basic addition and subtraction facts to 20 with ease is very important. Extra fact fluency practice is always a great way to reinforce those foundational skills of adding and subtracting.

In reading, the students are now applying all the sound patterns they learned along with important reading strategies to read more independently. When these strategies are in place, students are able to focus their attention on "thinking while they are reading" which builds strong comprehension skills. In writing, we are continuing to make sure our sentences have capitals and ending punctuation. Also the students have learned a little trick to help them build more interesting sentences: When, Who, Where, What, How, Why

Examples: (Last Friday, my friends and I went to an amazing show at the fairgrounds to watch a magician do cool magic tricks and allusions.)

(On Sunday, my mom and dad walked right into my room and surprised me with a cute and cuddly puppy for my birthday!)

In Science we are currently working on force and motion and soon we will begin rocks and soil.

In Social Studies we will be finishing our economic unit and we will be moving into our History Unit.

Eagle Press: Intermediate Classes

It is hard to believe that we are about halfway through the school year. We have been so busy learning so many new things that time is just flying by!

This month in English Language Arts students have been working on figurative language and reading folktales.

In Science, we have been studying light, learning how light can reflect, or refract, as well as how light can cause shadows and be absorbed. They have done many exciting experiments and are working as a Scientist by making predictions and collecting data.

In Social Studies students are learning about cultural diversity.

In Math, third graders have begun using the distributive property to multiply. They are breaking apart large multiplication sentences to smaller ones to help solve their problem. To ensure your third grader's success in math please continue to encourage your child to practice their multiplication facts to gain fluency. The third-grade team would like to thank you in advance for all you do to make sure your child is reading and practicing math facts every night.

Winter is here and we are halfway through the school year! Our students are working very hard in each of our classes.

In ELA we will be reading various texts where students will need to identify the plot, narrator's point of view and character's perspective. In writing, we are continuing with text-based argumentative essays.

In math, students are continuing to learn how to divide and starting to use operations with whole numbers to solve problems. These skills require multiplication so please continue to practice basic multiplication facts at home!

In Social Studies, we will be learning about Florida's history and its natives and how St. Augus-

tine was discovered and founded. All payments and forms MUST be turned in and paid in full by December 15th to make our final decision about attending. Thank you!



In 5th grade Math; Topic 6 focuses on developing under

standing of how to divide a decimal by a whole number as well as how to divide one decimal by another. Your child will use properties, number sense, models, and strategies to divide with decimals and solve problems. ELA:

The intent of Unit 3 is to build student knowledge around the Big Idea, what kinds of experiences can lead to new discoveries. The students will read several selections over the course of six weeks about the different ways that you can put a plan into action.

Science: Students will learn that our galaxy is the Milky Way, a spiral-shaped galaxy that is made of gas, dust, stars, and the objects orbiting those stars. They will understand the general characteristics of all 8 planets (Inner planets are small, have relatively thin atmospheres, few or no moons and Outer (gas giant) planets are large, have thick atmospheres, many moons, and rings) and learn the differences between stars (Sun), planets, moons, asteroids, and comets.

Social Studies: Students will continue to describe the social, political, and economic aspects of daily life in colonial America.



RAMP 4 & 5

Fourth grade RAMP students move from decimal place value to learning how to add and subtract decimals in December. Through using models, strategies, and understanding of decimal place value, students will learn to estimate, and then add and subtract multi-digit numbers with decimals to the thousandths.

Fifth grade RAMP students will begin exploring the world of ratios and rates in December. In the beginning of the unit students learn to model, write, and interpret ratios to show the relative sizes of two quantities using appropriate notation. Then, given a real-world context, determine a rate for a ratio of quantities with different units. Students will also build tables of equivalent ratios incorporating their understanding of unit rate. At the end of the unit, students will make connections between ratios and percentages and be able to apply ratio relationships to solve problems involving percentages.

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Music A big thank you to all who attended the Solar Bear Spirit Night. You helped raise over \$300 for the music program here at Eastbrook!

Did you know that making music engages and strengthens brainpower? Brain scans taken during musical performances show that virtually the entire cerebral cortex is active while musicians are playing.



How can I help my child face challenges with confidence?

Q: My third grader's response to new challenges is to say "I can't" before even trying. This lack of self-confidence is new this year. What should I do?

A: Several factors may be combining to lower your elementary schooler's self-confidence. For example:

- Your child may be afraid of making mistakes. Adults tend to point out things kids do wrong more than things they do right. Faultfinding can lead children to doubt their abilities.
- Your child may feel the need to be perfect.
 Children who feel this way may give up rather than attempt to do a task they aren't sure they can do with 100 percent accuracy.
- Your child may be suffering from comparisons. Kids who feel they can't measure up—especially when adults compare them to others—often stop trying.
- You may be "overdoing" for your child.
 When parents do tasks kids can do for themselves, the kids get the message that they are not capable.

To provide a self-confidence boost, explain that everyone makes mistakes and they help us learn. Praise the things your child does well. Show that you believe your child is a capable person, and eventually your child will believe it.

Show the Many Purposes of Reading

Your example is one of the best teachers around. So, to build your child's enthusiasm for reading, demonstrate the many things you gain from doing it. Let your child see you reading often. As you do, explain that you are:

- Reading to learn. "I am trying to figure out how to fix this leaky faucet. This article explains what to do."
- Reading for information. Show your child how you read a bus schedule in order to decide when to leave the house, or search online or in a cookbook to find a new way to prepare zucchini.
- Reading for enjoyment. Show that reading is a fun activity that's not just for school or work.
- Reading to pass time. Bring something to read wherever you go. Any time you and your child have to wait, read aloud together, or share a nugget from a book or article you are reading that might interest your elementary schooler.

Promote Physical Activity

Regular exercise helps children stay healthy and do better in school. But research shows that as early as age seven, children's physical activity levels start to decline. To help keep your child fit and learning well:

- Play active games.
- Have contests. See who can do the most jumping jacks in 30 seconds.
- Climb stairs. An average stair is 7.5 inches tall. How high can your child climb?
