Last quarter we celebrated our first quarter Sight Word champions, and it was fun. However, don't forget that while our kiddos did a fantastic job, sight words are a building process. Next quarter the students will have to know first quarter and second quarter sight words. Please keep practicing sight words with your child and continue to include first quarter words as well.

As we move into the Holiday Season, we would like to thank you for all you do to help us, help our students.

Happy November First Grade Families! November is a month filled with gratitude, which is so important as we gear up for the upcoming holiday season. First of all, we are grateful to all of the members of our Eastbrook family who have served or are currently serving our country in the military. It is a tremendous sacrifice that you make for us, and we are forever in your debt.

Secondly, our first-grade team reflects on all the good in our lives and we must note our amazing students and their families. We appreciate your continued support.

November will keep us very busy. We have our inhouse field trip on November 16th. Please make sure the permission slip has been turned in for your child to attend.

In Social Studies, we will be discussing economics. We will discuss needs vs. wants and goods and services.

In Reading, we will be starting our unit on changes over time. We will be using fiction and non-fiction texts to explore changes in time.

In Math, we learn many different strategies to help us add and subtract within 20.

In science, we will begin our unit on observing stars. The students will be learning that there are more stars in the sky than we can count. We will also be learning about magnifiers.

We hope you will have a safe and happy Thanksgiving holiday and enjoy family time together.



November brings lots of excitement. The children will be invited to preview books and then shop at our annual Fall Book Fair! The students will get a chance to see Eastbrook teachers and administration in a whole new light in our annual Talent Show. Veterans will be honored at an outside celebration complete with the Eastbrook Chorus. On a more academic side, Second Grade is moving right along. Some students have been participating in W.I.N which stands for What I Need. This W.I.N time provides for small group instruction on a variety of reading skills to help strengthen areas of need in reading.

In reading, we continue to work on long and short vowel sound patterns as well as decoding and blending letters to read and write words. The students have now been introduced to both fiction and non-fiction stories. With both fiction and nonfiction texts we continue to work on understanding the central idea and relevant details.

In math, students have been learning about a variety of different tools and strategies to add and subtract numbers to 100. Extra practice on basic addition and subtraction facts can make learning the higher numbers easier. Please remember, that at this grade level, they are not regrouping in the standard way. We are teaching the students to show a visual representation of their math problems. They are required to show a strategy they learned in class when they take their assessment. The algorithm method is

not yet taught or used at this grade level. It will be taught next year in 3rd arade. Please see below:



Finally we will end this month with our first in-house field trip. We have the great privilege of having Sawgrass, a Native Indian, come to Eastbrook to share wonderful artifacts and interesting stories about his culture. Thank you for your continued support!

Eagle Press: Intermediate Classes

In the month of November, our third graders will be finishing Unit 2 for English Language Arts which explained how people solve problems and come up with solutions. Unit 3 will help students explain why individual qualities are important and explain why historical events are important. In social studies, students will be learning how history and culture shape our community.

In science, our focus will be on different forms of energy, which include: mechanical, sound, electrical, and heat energy.

For mathematics, the focus will be on multi digit addition and subtraction with regrouping, and learning how multiplication and division are related. Please make sure third graders are reading every night and practicing their multiplication facts.



Happy fall! Our fourth graders have been busy, busy, busy and are working very hard in class.

In ELA, we will continue to read various texts that focus on reading to further understand text. They have been and will continue to work on using their inferencing skills to determine the author's perspective. In writing we are working on text-based argumentative essays.

In math students will be using operations with whole numbers to solve real world problems. Please continue to practice multiplication facts with your child every night!

In science students have been enjoying the handson labs and learning about the five different forms of energy. We will then be moving along to Earth's motion, sun, moon, and stars.

In social studies we wrapped up our geography unit and we will be moving on to Florida's history. With learning about Florida's history, we will have Mr. Sawgrass visit our school to talk about how Native Americans lived long ago. Please continue to make payments for our St. Augustine field trip. All payments are due by December 1st.

Thank you for your continuous support at home to help your child succeed in fourth grade! We hope you all have a safe and happy Thanksgiving holiday and enjoy family time together!! We have a lot to be thankful for this month! SO many exciting things have gone down already in 5th grade. We have had TWO visits to the Physics Bus and learned all about different types of energy! We even got to see our teachers get SHOCKED! We also got to take an amazing trip to the Dr. Philips Center to watch the Orlando Philharmonic. In November we will look forward to taking our trip to the Mud Walk, a Seminole County tradition!

In Science, we are moving on the force and motion. We will explore how there are many different types of forces that can cause motion and when applying forces to objects the more force acting on the object, the bigger the change in motion and the more mass an object has, the less effect a force will have on its motion.

In 5th grade Math, we are diving deeper into multiplication with whole numbers. We will be able to multiply three digit numbers by two digits with models and by using standard algorithm. We will also start to multiply whole numbers by numbers with decimals.

5th Grade RAMP, we will be able to plot and order numbers on the coordinate grid, including all four quadrants. We will also solve problems about distance, perimeter, and area on the coordinate grid. Then, we will move on to learn about rates and ratios.

ELA is spending all of November and December learning about IDEAS. We will gain knowledge around the Big Idea, what kinds of experiences can lead to new discoveries. We will read several selections over the course of six weeks about the different ways that you can put a plan into action.

Finally, in Social Studies, we are continuing on to learn about life in Colonial America. Different colonies had different geography, natural resources, commerce, and people. We will take a look into how these different regions contributed to the formation of our country.

RAMP 4 & 5

November finds the RAMP classes finishing our Fractions unit and moving to our Place Value with Whole Numbers and Decimals unit. We will begin by relating our knowledge of fractions, including mixed numbers and fractions greater than one to decimals. From there, we will explore place value to the thousandths place and learn how to represent those numbers in standard, word, and expanded form. With a good foundation of multi-digit numbers to the thousandths place, students will then plot, order, and compare those numbers. The unit ends with rounding. First, rounding numbers from 0 to 10,000 to the nearest 10, 100, and 1,000 as well as rounding multi-digit decimals to the thousandths, to the hundredths, to the tenths, or a whole number.

In the month of November students will plot, order, and compare positive and negative rational numbers using vertical and horizontal number lines. They will learn the absolute value of a number by stating how far a number and its opposite are from zero. Students will also apply this knowledge in a mathematical or real-world context when talking about distances, temperatures, finances, etc. At the end of the month, we will begin a unit on coordinate planes. Students will extend their previous understanding of plotting rational numbers and plot ordered pairs in four quadrants, finding distances between the ordered pairs, and solving real world problems, including finding the perimeter and area of a rectangle.

Music On October 27 the, the Eastbrook Chorus sang the National Anthem at the Orlando Solar Bears hockey game at the Amway Center as part of Eastbrook's Spirit Night with the Solar Bears. What an electric filled night for our Eagles. If you were there, thanks for cheering for us!

On November 10th the 4th and 5th Grade Chorus members will perform at Eastbrook's Annual Veterans Day Celebration. The members will be joined by the Lake Howell Jazz Band and N.J.R.O.T.C. Color Guard. The program begins at 10:00 a.m. The community is welcome to attend.

Eastbrook Annual Veterans Day Celebration will take place November 10th at 10:00 a.m. On this day, we pay tribute to all the people who have served in any branch of the armed services. The community is invited to the program that will include the Eastbrook Chorus, Lake Howell Jazz Band, and a special exhibition by Lake Howell's N.J.R.O.T.C Drill Team. 



2023 Teach In Guidelines

The speaker agrees with the following terms and conditions for speaking to students.

Registered/Background Checks: All classroom speakers must be approved by Community Involvement Office as a Seminole County Public School speaker. Classroom speakers are not required to be an approved Dividend/volunteer. Classroom speakers are required to clear through the Raptor Visitor screening once on a school campus.

Advertising: Materials that carry advertising may not be distributed without prior approval from Seminole County Public School.

<u>Promotion:</u> Collection of student names, addresses or telephone numbers for the promotion of speakers' business is prohibited.

Smoking: Smoking is prohibited on the campus of all Seminole County Public Schools.

Religion: No religious viewpoint should be presented.

Politics: Advocating a particular political viewpoint is NOT permitted.

<u>Dress:</u> Appropriate dress is required when speaking in Seminole County Public Schools.

<u>School Board Personnel:</u> Teacher or school board employee must be present throughout the presentation.

<u>Speakers Role:</u> The role of any speaker is education and explanation. Materials and presentation must not denigrate any culture, race, gender, national origin, or religion. In addition, while information on politics, religion, culture, or ethnicity may be presented, proselytizing is NOT permitted.

The information presented must be accurate and factual.

Appropriate language and behavior are required.

<u>School Officials</u>: School officials have the right and the responsibility to interrupt the presentation with a warning and/or to stop the presentation for any violation of this agreement.

How to make the most of your parent-teacher conference

Parent-teacher conferences can feel nervewracking, but there's no need to worry! Think of this meeting as an opportunity to meet with your child's teacher one-on-one and to get a comprehensive look at what your child's school life is

"Your child's teacher is solely dedicated to you during your conference time," says Jaclyn Pearson, a 1st grade teacher in Illinois.

Teachers want to be informed of any changes your child is facing in their personal or family life. You'll get a sense of how they behave at home in comparison to how they act at school. By working together, you and your child's teacher can better understand their needs.

"Don't be hesitant to receive clarification or discuss an issue that could be better understood with face-to-face interaction," Pearson advises. With so much to talk about in so little time, here are eight tips to make the most of your parentteacher conferences this year:

Before the Parent-Teacher Conference

1. Prep Early

Don't wait until the night before to get organized. Create a folder at the beginning of the year in which you keep test scores, big assignments, and any notes. Don't worry if you haven't been doing that so far — just pull together any materials you have, and jot down questions.

- 2. Talk to Your Child on a Daily Basis Ask how they're doing in class, and about what's going on during lunchtime, recess, and when they go to special classes like music or PE. Bring any concerns to the teacher's attention as soon as possible-If you wait for too long, the teacher may not know exactly what situation you are referring to.
- 3. Find Out the Communication Protocol Don't let conferences be the only time you talk to your child's teacher. Ask them how they prefer to communicate, whether it's by email, text or phone calls.

During the Parent-Teacher Conference

4. Arrive Early (Whether Your Conference Is In-Person or Online)

PARENTS

With only a few precious minutes to spend, you don't want to be late and shorten time with your child's teacher.

5. Go in With a Positive Attitude

The goal of both the teacher and you should be the success of your child. Arrive with a compliment to start the conference off on the right foot, such as "My son is really enjoying the unit on space" or "We had a great time on the field trip." Then address any concerns respectfully.

6. Ask Questions

While the discussion will likely touch on grades and good study habits, you also want to ask about the parts of your child's school life that can't be measured by test scores and homework, such as character and friendships. If you have questions, ask them! Your child's teachers are just as interested in your input as you are in theirs. Here are a couple of questions that will spark an insightful conversation about vour child:

*Is there a particular behavior you noticed about my child?

*Who are my child's closest friends?

*What type of learner is my child?

Does my child participate in classroom activities and discussions?

After the Parent-Teacher Conference

7. Follow Up

If the teacher brings something to your attention that needs to be addressed with your child, take steps to put the plan in motion, whether it's working on organizational skills, helping them with homework, or talking about a social-emotional issue.

8. Update Your Child on How Things Went Start with the positive things their teacher had to say, then fill them in on any concerns you and the teacher discussed. Explain how you can all work together to ensure your child stays motivated for a successful school year.
