

K Hello Kindergarten Families, What a fantastic January we had in kindergarten, and now we're ready for an even more exciting February! Our little ones smoothly got back into their routines after the winter break, and I hope this month brings health and happiness to all. Every school day matters, so let's keep the positive vibes going by having your child join us each day.

This month, we're continuing to make friends and create wonderful memories for our kiddos. Our goal is to make the kindergarten environment full of love and joy for them every single day.

In Reading, we will keep working with our sight words as we prepare for First Grade. It's essential that our students are Ready. Also, make sure to read daily to your child. Reading is incredibly important in kindergarten as it establishes the foundation for lifelong literacy skills. Beyond teaching letters and words, it plays an important role in developing language, cognition, and emotional intelligence. Early exposure to reading not only prepares children for academic success but also instills a love for learning, setting the stage for a positive and enthusiastic educational journey.

In math, we are working with addition and subtraction. Also, we are currently working on math fluency. Math fluency in kindergarten provides a crucial foundation for future academic success, enhancing problem-solving skills and easing the transition to more advanced mathematical concepts. Also, we are going to explore numbers from 11 to 20 very soon. This means we'll be counting, representing, and working with these numbers, including writing the numerals and breaking down the "teen" numbers into groups of ten and some extra ones. Get ready for some math fun!

A heartfelt thank you to all our wonderful kindergarten parents for your unwavering commitment to your child's learning journey. Your dedication plays a crucial role in creating a supportive and enriching environment for our young learners.

Happy February, First Grade Families! Our classrooms are full of love and learning this month! Be on the lookout for information from your child's teacher about Valentine's activities they will be doing in class. In Language Arts, we will continue to identify characters, setting, important events, and the moral of the story using a variety of texts. We will also look at informational texts, identifying the main point and key details. In writing, we are continuing to focus on writing complete sentences. We will discuss President's Day in the classroom.

In Phonics, we will be fishing up learning all our sounds and really starting to practice reading different texts, not only words. We will be starting sentence dictation instead of spelling so we can practice and apply all the skills we have learned this year. Please keep practicing those sight words!

In math, we are stating place value and start addition and subtraction within 100. Please continue to practice counting on ones and tens from any number.

In Science, we discuss Earth's surface and what living things need. Many students really enjoy learning about the plants and animals in their surroundings. Please point out living things as you come across them in your daily activities and discuss what that living thing needs to survive and discuss why non-living things do not have those needs.

In social Studies, we will be discussing Geography and how where you live affects your everyday life. As always, we thank you for supporting us and your child's learning!

Hello everyone!

We recognized the milestone of the 100th day of school on January 24th. We are excited that we have now officially passed the halfway point of second grade! Your students are closer to third grade than 1st grade. We hope that you are seeing the growth that we are seeing in their reading, writing, math, and science skills as well as their study habits. We recognized their achievements at the Awards Ceremony and seeing so many of you there encouraging and supporting your children was wonderful! Literacy Week was also great fun! We LOVE seeing our students read!

This month, we will exchange Valentines and share the joy of being able to celebrate friendships. You should receive a letter and a list of student names from your child's teacher. Our Friendship Celebration will be on Wednesday, February 14th. Please send in Valentine Boxes & Cards by Monday Feb. 12.

We look forward to our field trip Giraffes Can't Dance on Feb 9. Please make sure all money, parent authorization forms and field trip forms have been turned into your teacher. In Reading, we continue to work a great deal on building fluency and on comprehension of what we read. We are learning about weather in science, and 3 digit addition and subtraction in math using a variety of strategies. We are stressing the importance of neatness and taking time on math problems to ensure accuracy. We also encourage students to continue completing their weekly homework, read regularly, get their 30 minutes of I-ready in both reading & math and complete a minimum of 1 AR quiz each week. We truly appreciate all of your help and support.

Wow! We can't believe it's February al ready. Our students have been working so hard and achieving personal goals. We have our Field Trip to the Environmental Center on Wednesday February 7th. This will allow us to go and explore nature up close and personal.

In Reading, we will continue to talk about different text structures such as chronology, cause and effect and compare and contrast. We will also be working more with vocabulary and finding the prefixes and suffixes within words.

In Math, in addition to reviewing multiplication and division facts, we will be learning about Geometry: Shapes, Area and Perimeter.

In Science we will be focusing on Light and Heat. We will also study the sun and stars.

In Social Studies, we are learning about the Economy and why its important.

Please continue to make sure that your students are reading every night and completing their homework. They also need to practice their math facts daily!

Happy February! The next few months are going to be very busy, but we are excited to share with you what we will be learning. In ELA, students will continue to work on reading comprehension skills. We will be reading more texts that talk about character development, narrators' point of view, central idea, relevant details and theme. In math, students will be learning how to multiply fractions with whole numbers. Please continue to practice multiplication facts at home! In science students are working hard when doing labs in class. We will be learning about rocks and minerals and how to identify the different types and also how each of them is formed on Earth. In social studies we will be learning about the effects of the Spanish in Florida and how it became a state. In RAMP students are working on dividing whole numbers and decimals. Then, they will multiply and divide multi-digit numbers with decimals to the hundredths place using estimation, rounding and place value.

5th grade students enjoyed their second field trip of the year to NASA's Kennedy Space Center. This science based field trip had our students coding and performing operations with robots, learning about botany on Mars, and exploring the history of different space programs and a glance to the future of space exploration.

ELA- In February we continue Unit 4, asking "how do we decide what's important?" The students conclude their text sets and determine what information is important and how to differentiate important information vs supplemental information.

Math 5- After concluding the unit on the coordinate plane 5th grade mathematicians will start their study of fractions. The will start with adding and subtracting fractions then move on to multiplying and dividing fractions.

Science- We will be learning about plants, animals, and the environment. In these lessons, students will learn that plants and animals are adapted to live in specific environments and when the environment changes, some plants and animals are able to survive while others do not.

Social Studies- After we complete the study of the American Revolution, we will move on to Civics and Economics in America. The leading question is how did the Constitution and Bill of Rights give Americans a foundation for political and economic success?



Music We are having a fantastic time in music class. 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students have started recorder and we are learning our first recorder songs of the year. Recorders are still for sale in the music room for \$10. Kindergarten, 1st & 2nd graders have had a great time singing, dancing, and play-




ing instruments. Ask your child which instrument he or she likes best. Everyone is enjoying the strumming sounds of the ukulele!

Positive Behaviorial Interventions & Supports

What is PBIS ?

PBIS is an evidence-based three-tiered prevention framework to improve and integrate all the data, systems, and practices impacting student outcomes. National research shows that full implementation of PBIS leads to reduced exclusionary discipline and improved student and teacher outcomes. With the PBIS framework, we are developing skills, making improved system changes to our school environment, acknowledging appropriate behavior, and using data to identify support for all of our students.

PBIS Framework

- 1. Build safe, positive school climates
- 2. Enhance and support effective school systems
- 3. Include all stakeholder input and support
 - a) Faculty and staff
 - b) Students and families
 - c) Community members

PBIS Goals

- 1. Create environments that help students achieve success
- 2. Develop positive, supportive relationships among stakeholders
- 3. Prevent problem behaviors from occurring
- 4. Teach appropriate behaviors
- 5. Acknowledge appropriate behaviors of all stakeholders

Family and Community Members as Partners

As a part of these efforts, time and resources are dedicated to student, family, and community relationships. Close participation of family and community members is critical for student success.

What can you do as a family member to support PBIS?

1. Share your knowledge about how your child learns best and ways for supporting your child's behavior, including background and cultural information, with your child's teacher and school staff.

Ask your child's teacher about options for ensuring that home-school communication is maintained and that positive experiences, as well as any concerns, can be discussed proactively.
Express your interest in your child's education to both your child and to his/her teacher. Talk to your child about the importance of education and positive behavior. Ask your child for specific examples that illustrate behavior demonstrating the Tier 1 expectations throughout their day (e.g., "How did you show Respectful behavior during math today?")

4. Express your interest in the success of the school by asking your child's principal and class-room teacher about options to engage with and participate in areas of importance to the school. 5. Share your understanding of your child's issues with your child's teacher. Ask your child's principal and teacher how you can help in problem-solving within the school and community.

What can you do as a community member to support PBIS?

1. Share knowledge about community resources with school staff and family members.

2. Provide and support the school's access to resources.

3. Look for opportunities to reinforce behavioral expectations and provide acknowledgments to students within and across community settings.
